

Jon,
I met out there with Nam Siu and the project consultants. I absolutely agree that the 'ditch' is fish bearing, and that in fact was the conclusion (the actual finding of fish presence only sealed the deal, as it were). The adjacent parcel is/was proposed for a subdivision, with stormwater ultimately discharging to this drainage. The resulting buffers from this stream type determination, however, may halt the project altogether or at least it will need to be substantially revised.

As for location, the red star below is the location of the recent Bjorgen Creek crossing as I recall, and the yellow is the location of the fish (so yes, further up in the system, but different stream). I've since learned that the downstream barriers on private property may only be partial based on WDFW's data, but the confirmed fish presence upstream certainly strengthens the argument for fixing them. That is outside the scope of what I'm looking at here though. I was only wondering if you had had any personal knowledge of this particular reach since it is not mapped, and of course to share the finding. I think we are good for now, but if anything more comes up, I'll let you know. Thanks! Kathlene

Kathleen- who from WDFW did you meet with?

What is the intended fate of said "ditch"? Just because it is a ditch does not necessarily mean it is not a Fish bearing waterway. Take Dogfish Creek, for example - the fork which runs along Bond Rd is largely ditched almost the whole way from Pugh Rd down through to Big Valley. This ditched stream contains all the Pacific Salmon as well as cutthroat and steelhead.

Admittedly, I do not know much about this piece of water or its associated habitat. Where would this in relation to where a culvert on Bjorgen Cr was recently replaced off of Noll Rd this last summer? I believe that was pretty far up in the watershed and they had coho and cutthroat present there. Alison and/ or Steve may know.

Also....question: if there are know fish blockages downstream on private property, shouldn't we be asking to have those corrected? If they were corrected, there most certainly would probably be fish, or at least the potential for fish in the section you are asking about?

I would be happy to meet you on site for a brief examination of this water.

Let me know.


I just assume at least cutthroat are ubiquitous in all E.Kitsap streams and ponds (per E. Kitsap Limiting Factors Refugia Study).

Hi Jon,

I was out with WDFW this morning on a pre-project site visit to determine if a 'roadside ditch' along the west side of Noll Rd. was a stream or not (highlighted parcel for location). I was explaining how **the channel still met Type F requirements despite its location, when this guy (see below) alerted us to it's presence. I am curious if you have ever surveyed this reach or know of cutthroat to be this far up in this watershed or on this side of the road?** There is a culvert at the corner of Noll where this drainage enters into the mapped stream, but there are a few farm ponds immediately downstream of here with supposedly limited (if any) fish passage.

FYI, we believe it's a cutthroat due to the maxillary past the middle of eye ball. Big one, around 16 inches. I put it back downstream in the culvert where there was more depth and water. I didn't want to relocate to ponds on private properties or into another system. I suspect it came from one of the ponds on this system and moved upstream looking to spawn.





Good morning Ben,

Thank you for speaking with me on the phone yesterday and providing the email with the figure. Since I had it on my calendar and was already in the Poulsbo area I decided to take a look yesterday afternoon. Alas, I think it would be best to wait till we can all get out there together to make a final determination.

As you can imagine, there was a lot of water flowing through the system yesterday with all the rain and snow melt. The ditch/drainage crosses under Noll Rd through a substantial culvert (36" or 48") and connects to unnamed stream to the east through a wetland. The ditched portion itself had well sorted streambed sediments which is distinctly different from the connecting ditch, south of the Noll Rd corner, that runs west to east and has angular quarry spalls. I followed the drainage approximately a quarter mile north along Noll Rd where it veers to the northwest away from the road side and continues as a natural stream through private property and I was able to observe it from a driveway. Please see attached document for photos.

Based on my observations, I believe this to be a natural drainage/stream that had been altered and ditched during the construction of Noll Rd. That said, I think we need to come to an agreement on this as well as determine connectivity and stream typing. However as I mentioned, we will wait till we can get everyone out there before making a final determination.

I can be available on the after 2 PM on the 12th, and tentatively the afternoon of the 13th.

Are you able to provide any additional information? Site plan, draft report, etc.? I'm not sure I'm familiar with where this proposal will exactly be. In most cases, if there is any question on stream typing determination, we would request a site visit, inclusive of the consulting biologist, WDFW and the local permitting jurisdiction. I do have some time later tomorrow afternoon, but if you can provide any info prior-to, that will help.
